

3. Equal Treatment

Our aim is to encourage applications from candidates with as diverse a range of backgrounds as possible. This enriches our community and is vital in preparing our pupils for today's world. We are committed to equal treatment for all, regardless of a candidate's race, ethnicity, religion, sexual orientation or social background.

Walhampton nevertheless has strong Christian roots and pupils are expected to attend the school's daily and weekly chapel services.

4. Special Needs

We welcome pupils with special educational needs, providing that our Learning Support Unit can offer them the support that they require. Likewise, we welcome pupils with physical disabilities provided that we can reasonably make any required adjustments to our facilities.

We advise parents of children with special needs or disabilities to discuss their child's requirements with us before he or she proceeds with the trial day so that we can make adequate provision. Parents should provide a copy of an Educational Psychologist's report or a medical report where appropriate.

5. Scholarships and Bursaries

Walhampton offers scholarships for academic excellence and sporting talent. Exceptional musical and artistic abilities may also be taken into account.

Means-tested bursaries are offered in order to make it possible for those who meet the school's admission criteria but whose parents are unable to pay full fees to nevertheless benefit from the many opportunities that Walhampton offers.

We encourage any parent who feels that they will struggle to pay full tuition fees to consider applying for a scholarship and / or bursary. Further details can be found in the school's Awards policy, which is available on the website.

6. Overseas Applicants

We welcome overseas pupils but Walhampton does not run a short-term study programme and we expect all of our pupils to join the school for at least a year. Parents living overseas must make provision for their children to travel home or be looked after outside of school during exeat weekends and holidays.

In order to cope with the academic and social demands, pupils should have a reasonable knowledge of English. Tuition in English as an Additional Language (EAL) will be arranged on request at extra cost.
