# Introduction from the Head

A Walhampton education is transformational. There are few schools which can offer a setting quite like Walhampton's one hundred acres of woodland, lawns, and lakes with views across the Solent to the hills of the Isle of Wight.

It is the perfect place to celebrate the joys of childhood, and the potential of learning. I am very proud of our setting. Then I think again. It is not actually the grounds and buildings I am proud of. It's what they represent. Children who come to Walhampton are reaching their potential - in the classroom, on the games field, musically and in the creative arts - wherever their passion lies. Such opportunity significantly enhances their life chances, future options and life-long outcomes.

The School already offers means-tested financial support to children from a wide range of backgrounds, and the Walhampton School Foundation Trust is intended to secure for the long term our ongoing goal to achieve John Bradfield's vision of enabling children whose families, for whatever reason, have limited financial means. The most effective way to meet this challenge is to create a sustainable source of annual income in the form of an endowment fund which over the long term will provide bursaries for these children.

Nearly two years into my headship, part of the joy of deepening my understanding of Walhampton has been reflecting on what has made - and what continues to make - Walhampton a great school. We do not judge educational success simply by

measurable outcomes, but by the sort of young people that the School sends off to senior school and into society. We believe our children represent the values of the School, which are at the heart of all we do, and these, coupled with an increasing awareness of the diverse and dynamic world around them, consideration for others, and above all kindness, help to make young people from Walhampton very special indeed. We are proud of them all, and we seek to ensure that they feel they "belong".

## About the Trust

The Walhampton School Foundation
Trust is a charity, providing a new
structure for fundraising. Its main
purpose is the provision of bursaries to
enable pupils to enter the School who
do not otherwise have the means to pay
school fees. In that way, the Trust enables
us to build a valuable legacy for the
future, which fulfils one of the founding
objectives of the School – to broaden
access to the education our School offers
in the community.

#### Relationship with the School

The Foundation Trust will seek to build on the traditions of the School and its history, including the history and traditions of Hordle House. Fundraising will be led by the Foundation Trust Board, in conjunction with the Governors, Head and the Alumni Office.

### Application of funds

The Foundation Trust will assist the School in two principal ways:

- By providing funds for the provision of bursaries
- By providing funds for capital and special projects

Special projects may include assisting the School in its support for the local community, inline with its charitable activities.



## Our mission

Walhampton is proud to be a Royal National Children's SpringBoard accredited school, and shares in the belief of the life-transforming potential of fully-funded bursaries for children and young people facing social or economic disadvantage and other vulnerabilities.

The SpringBoard accreditation recognises that we are able to provide excellent pastoral care, academic support and a vibrant co-curricular environment that will provide SpringBoarders with diverse opportunities to thrive.

We work closely with SpringBoard to identify appropriate candidates for bursary awards and in preparing young people for their transition to Walhampton, but we need help to increase financial support so that more children can access a Walhampton education.
