Co-Curricular Pre-Prep Timings

For Years 1 and 2 Co-Curricular will take place after school at 15:30 to 16:30. After School Club is also available every day for pupils from Nursery to Year 2 until 17:15 or until 18:00 with a hot meal.

Co-Curricular Prep School Timings and Structure

Morning Clubs will run before the school day and are optional. These clubs are ideal for focused or skill-based sessions like Strength & Conditioning and Chapel Choir.
